

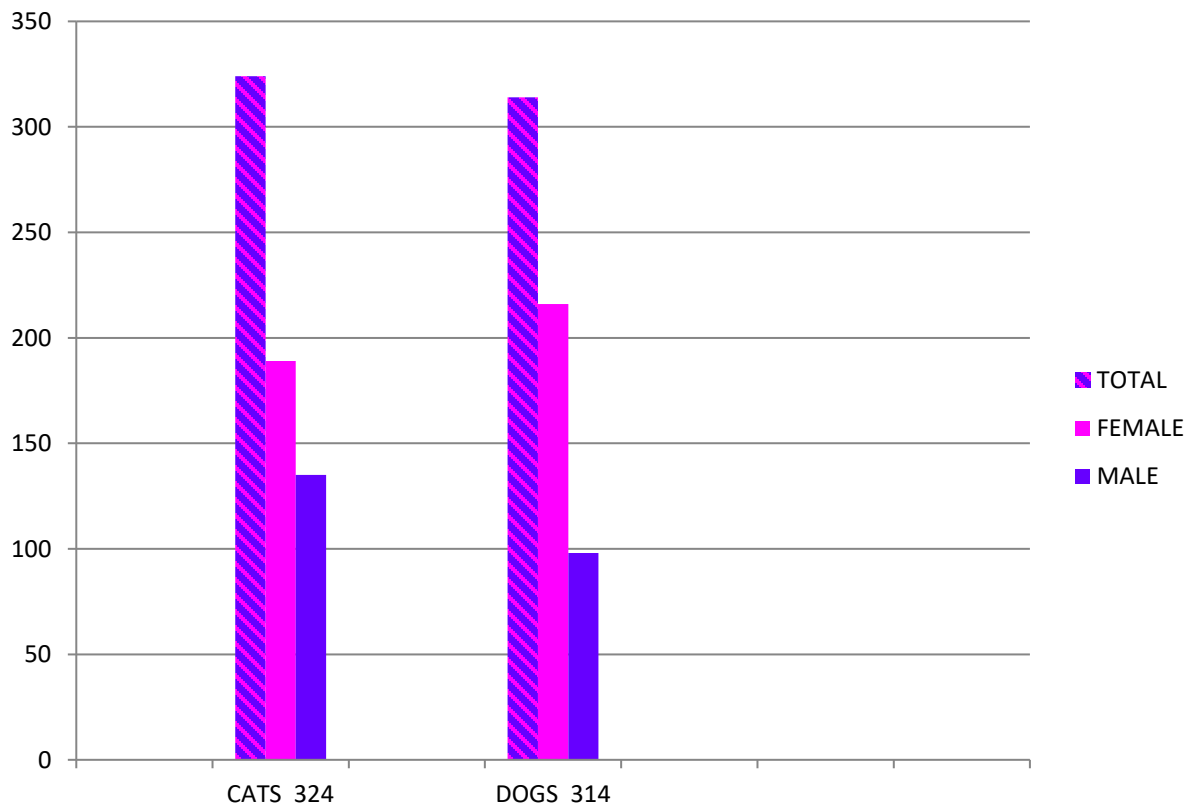
2015 REPORT FROM THE PRESIDENT

During this past year we continued our labor of rescuing the animals most in need in our communities. Our relationship with the State of Jalisco is solid, as they continue to support our spay & neuter efforts. This year we also tried something new by hosting a Pet Health Fair. Our vets did health checks, dewormed, and vaccinated animals. Our volunteers bathed dogs. We had an adoption area and were able to place animals in new homes.

STERILIZATIONS

We averaged 24 sterilizations per month over the course of 2015 (performed by our vets in Barra and Melaque), plus we attended an additional 354 animals during two spay & neuter campaigns. In June we hosted a 5-day campaign (237 animals total) and in September we hosted a 2-day campaign (117 animals attended). The average cost per animal during our high-volume clinics is under \$85 pesos! Our grand total for the year is 638 animals sterilized.

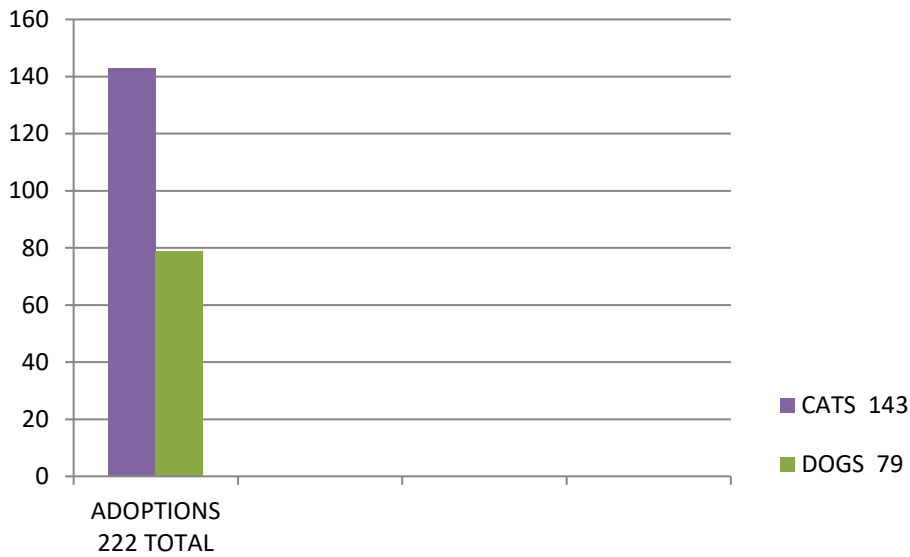
STERILIZATIONS 2015



ADOPTIONS

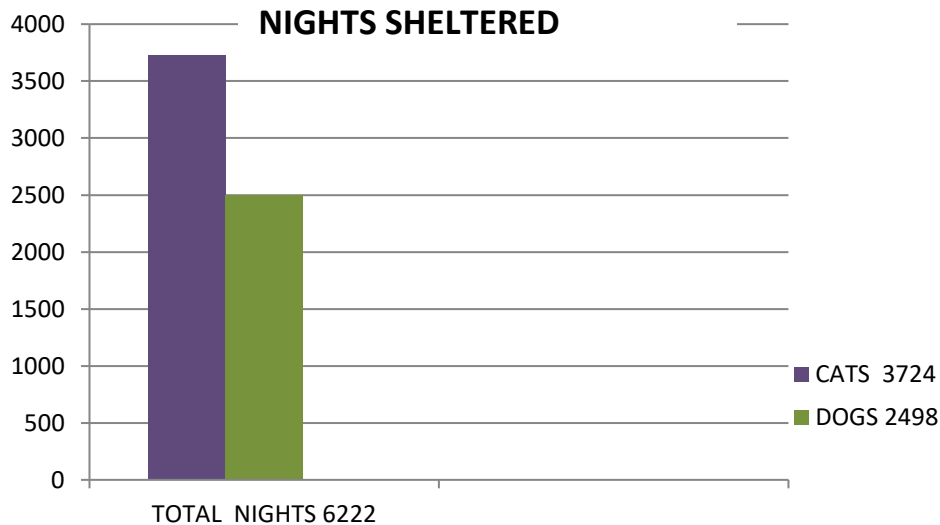
We continue to deal mostly with kittens, and also a fair amount of puppies. We have had some success in placing adult dogs and cats as well. New families are happy to receive healthy animals that have been dewormed, spayed or neutered, and vaccinated as well. We also send each animal to its new home with a bag of food, toys, and in the case of dogs, a collar and leash.

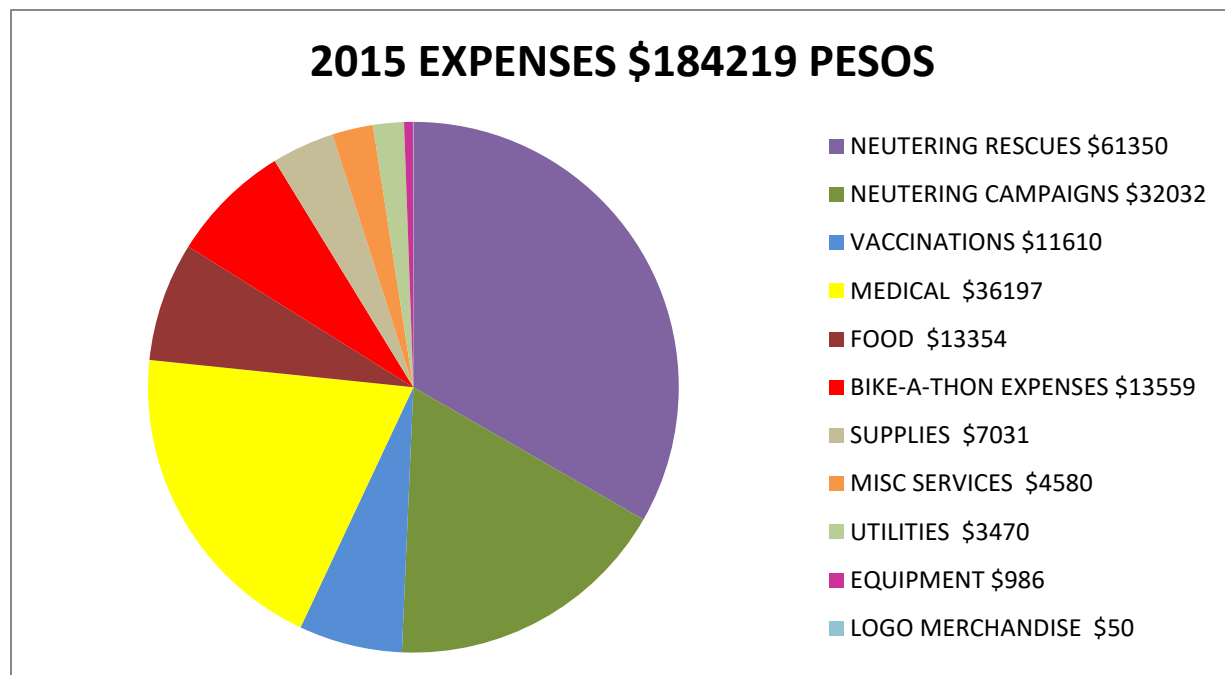


FINANCIALS

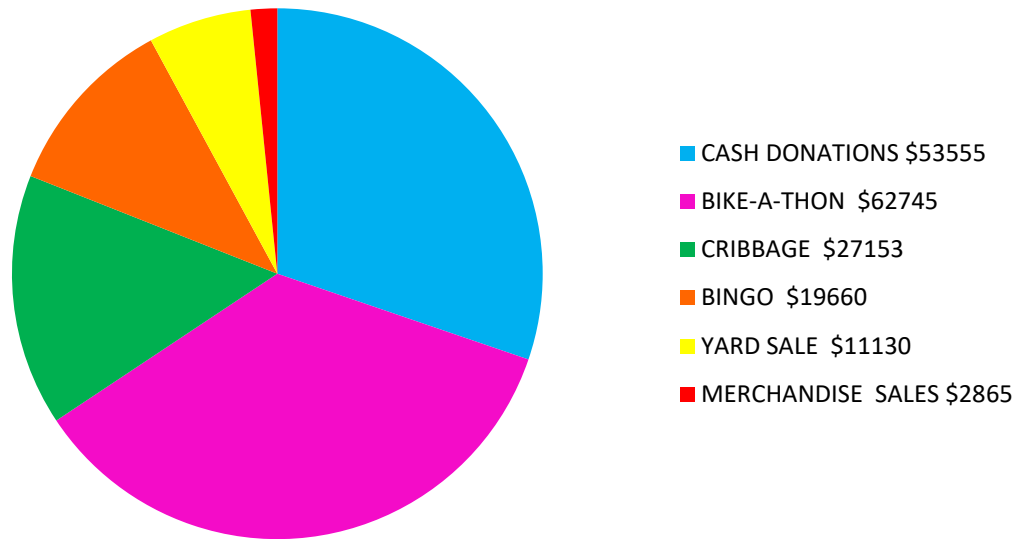
